4. List the risks and benefits of using lasers in skin of color
5. Identify the issues regarding skin cancer in persons of color

Case Presentations:

1. Study unusual conditions, or unusual presentations of common conditions
2. Evaluate the pathogenesis of certain unusual conditions
3. Explain treatment options for these unusual cases

## Course Description and Target Audience

This conference will provide dermatology residents, faculty and private practitioners with an overview of new developments in dermatopathology and in the dermatologic care of ethnic skin. Participants will have an opportunity to observe and hear discussions on a variety of common and uncommon cutaneous diseases. This conference will provide the participants with a better understanding of a variety of skin diseases and management of those diseases.

Turn right at the light onto Cary Street. For self parking, take an immediate right into the James Center underground parking. For valet parking, take an immediate right onto 12th Street and into the hotel motor entrance.

### DIRECTIONS FROM THE NORTH – VIA I-95 SOUTH

Take exit 74A (Downtown Expressway). Take the Canal Street exit and make right onto 10th Street, then a right onto Cary Street. Turn right onto 12th Street and make an immediate right into the hotel entrance.

### DIRECTIONS FROM THE SOUTH – VIA I-95 NORTH

Take I-95 north to exit 74A onto I-195 (toll road). Then take the Canal Street exit and pay the toll (\$0.20). Turn right onto 10th Street. Turn right at the light onto Cary Street.
